6 Makeup Problems Every Beginner Should Recognize

What you see, what it means, and one simple thing to try first.

● CAKEY

Makeup looks visibly thick, dry, powdery, or built up.

Try first: Use a thinner layer and add coverage only where needed.

● CREASING

Concealer or foundation gathers in natural folds as the face moves.

Try first: Use less product directly over the deepest folds.

● PILLING

Layers roll into tiny balls, crumbs, or flakes while you blend.

Try first: Use thinner layers, let the previous layer settle, and reduce rubbing.

● FLASHBACK

Makeup looks unexpectedly light or ashy in flash photos.

Try first: Take a test flash photo and identify which area changes.

● PATCHY

Coverage or color looks uneven from one area to another.

Try first: Stop adding more everywhere; blend the edges and inspect the uneven area.

● COLOR SHIFT / "OXIDIZING"

Foundation looks darker, warmer, or more orange after it settles.

Try first: Compare the same swatch before and after settling in the same light.
